INTRODUCTION

The Tamil Nadu Agricultural University (TNAU) Coimbatore is a Global Center of Excellence in agricultural education and research in planning for its future as well as for conducting its ongoing activities, the TNAU seeks to act in a manner that is guided by a deep-rooted sense of shared values and aspirations. Built upon such a foundation, the Institute honours and rewards high performance in learning, teaching, scholarship, research and creative activities by encouraging intellectual curiosity and protecting the multiple expressions of academic freedom, seeks to provide an environment conducive to imaginative innovation, experimentation and creativity by encouraging all members of the academic community to take intellectual and creative risks and to embrace changes that will enhance the fulfillment of the Institute's mission, aspires to build an environment of tolerance and reasoned debate without any gender-cast-religious - or regional - bias by affirming the worth and personal dignity of every member of the institute community and contributing to a campus climate of civility.

The Tamil Nadu Agricultural University has its beginning with an Agricultural School established at Saidapet, Chennai in 1876 which later blossomed to a college. In 1906, the college was shifted to Coimbatore. In 1920, the college was affiliated to the University of Madras with the introduction of a three-year degree program. Till 1946, the Agricultural College and Research Institute, Coimbatore was the only institute for Agricultural Education for the whole of South India. In 1958, it was recognized as a Post-Graduates Centre leading to Masters and Doctoral degrees. The Agricultural College & Research Institute, Madurai was established in 1965. These two colleges formed the nucleus of the Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, when it was established during 1971 offering four year B.Sc. (Ag.) degree program.

In 1972, two new degree programs of B.Sc. (Horticulture) and B.E. (Agriculture) were started. In 1979, the Faculty of Horticulture was established. In 1980, B.Sc. (Home Science) was started at Madurai Campus. The third Agricultural College was started at Killikulam in 1984 and the fourth at Navalur Kuttappattu, Trichy in 1989, offering B.Sc. (Agriculture) program. B.Sc. (Forestry) program was started during 1985.

Presently the B.Sc. (Horticulture) degree program is being offered at Horticultural College and Research Institute, Periyakulam and B.Sc. (Forestry) at Forest College and Research Institute, Mettupalayam. B.Tech. (Agricultural Engineering) is offered at Agricultural Engineering College & Research Institute, Kumalur. B.Sc. (Home Science) degree program is offered at Home Science College and Research Institute, Agricultural College Campus, Madurai. B.Sc. (Agriculture) and B.Sc. (Horticulture) program are being offered by Self-Financing Adhiparasakthi Agricultural College, Kalavai which are affiliated to Tamil Nadu Agricultural University since 1999. Two more self-financing colleges namely Vanavarayar Institute of Agriculture, Pollachi and Thanthai Roever Institute of Agriculture and Rural Development (TRIARD), Perambalur are also offering B.Sc. (Agriculture) during 2008-09 academic year. Apart from these academic institutes, the University conducts research programs at 36 research stations spread all over Tamil Nadu.

The ever changing agricultural scenario made the Tamil Nadu Agricultural University to start the following new degrees viz. B.Tech. (Food Process Engineering) during 1998-99, B.Tech. (Biotechnology), B.Tech. (Horticulture) during 2002-03 and B.Tech. (Energy and Environmental Engineering) during 2004 - 2005. A new degree program, B.Tech. (Bioinformatics) was introduced from the academic year 2006-07. Considering the retailing boom and growth of IT services in India and elsewhere, two new courses

B.S. (Agribusiness Management) and B.Tech. (Agricultural Information Technology) we are introduced from the academic Year 2007-08.

At present the University is offering the following 12 Undergraduate Degree Programs of four years duration.

i. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO ALL UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMS

A pass in the Higher Secondary Course (10+2) or any other examination recognized as equivalent there to and fulfilling the following requirements.

Ranking Procedure

Mark in each of the four subjects would be converted to 50 as

Mark Obtained

$$\frac{\text{Maximum Mark}}{\text{Maximum Mark}} \times 50$$

and the aggregate of the four subjects would be taken for ranking for maximum of 200 marks (50 x 4 = 200).

In the case of qualifying examination other than Tamilnadu Higher Secondary (HSC) Examination, normalization procedure as ordered in the Tamil Nadu Admission in Professional Educational Institutions Act, 2006 (Tamil Nadu Act 3 of 2007), G.O. M.S. 190 Agriculture (AP.6) Department dt 16.5.2007 and G.O. M.S. 191 Agriculture (AP.6) Department dt 16.5.2007 shall be adopted for computing minimum eligibility and ranking.

In cases where more than one student have got the same marks in the common merit list, the inter-se merit among such students shall be determined in the order of priority as specified below:

- i. Marks out of 50.00 in Mathematics or Botany or Biology
- ii. Marks out of 50.00 in Physics
- iii. Marks out of 50.00 in Chemistry
- iv. Date of Birth - Oldest first

b. HSC - Vocational Stream: As 5% of total seats are exclusively reserved for candidates under Vocational Stream, they are not considered under general merit and any other reservation categories. Vocational group candidates are eligible for the following degree programs :

d. Number of Attempts to pass

For the purpose of qualifying examination marks the maximum number of attempts to pass for admission to all the courses are as follows:

1. Scheduled Castes/ Scheduled Tribes : Three
2. All other Communities : Two

e. The candidates who have not studied X, XI and XII standards in Tamil Nadu should produce the certificate of permanent residence in Tamil Nadu in the prescribed proforma (*Certificate - TNAU/2010-1* enclosed) from competent authorities.

f. Physical standards requirement

A certificate regarding the physical standards prescribed may be obtained from a Medical Officer of Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, Coimbatore at the time of admission.

Note for those whom aspiring IFS exams Please check the physical standard requirement with appropriate agency.

g. A students of TNAU who discontinued a course in the undergraduate programme is not eligible for admissions again to any other undergraduate programmes of this university.

ii. AGE LIMIT

Candidates should not have completed the age of 21 years on the first day of July of the admission year for all the courses. However, for Scheduled Castes/ Scheduled Tribes there is no age limit.

iii. RESERVATIONS

The reservation categories are mutually exclusive and a candidate can opt for **only one reservation** category though the candidate may be eligible under one or more category. The reservation will be followed as per the orders of the Government of Tamil Nadu at the time of admission.

A. Rule of Reservation is as follows :

Open competition - 31%

Backward - 30%*

(* Within the 30% reservation for Backward Classes 26.5% Backward Classes other than BC Muslims
3.5% for Backward class Muslims)

Most backward/Denotified - 20%

Schedule Caste - 18% (16% seats offered to Arunthathiyars within the seats reserved for SC)

Scheduled Tribe - 1%

* Tamil Nadu Ordinance No. 4 of 2007 published in the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette extraordinary No 262 dt 15.09.2007, provide the reservation in respect of annual permitted strength in each branch or faculty for admission into educational institutions in the state including private educational institutions for the Backward Class Muslims shall be three and one-half percent with in the thirty percent reservation for Backward Class as provided in the 1994 Act and in 2006 Act.

G.O. Ms. No. 50, Adi Dravidar and tribal welfare (TD-2) 29th April 2009. (16% seat offered to Arunthathiyars within the seats reserved for scheduled castes for admission in Educational Institution.

B. Ten percent seats are filled by Indian Council of Agricultural Research, New Delhi through a National Level Entrance Examination for B.Sc. (Agriculture), B.Sc.(Horticulture), B.Sc. (Forestry), B.Sc.(Home Science) and B.Tech. (Agricultural Engineering)

C. Certain number of seats are also reserved for the following categories, as prescribed by the Government of Tamil Nadu under G.O. MS No 167 dt 25/4/08. A separate certificate with necessary details has to be filed along with application for claiming each of these reservations.

a. Ex-servicemen (*attach proof*)

Six Seats in B.Sc.(Ag.) and **One Seat** each in B.Sc (Hort.) and in B.Tech. (Agri. Engg.) Degree Programme is reserved for Son/Daughter of Ex-servicemen. The applicant should possess minimum qualifying marks and should attach the proof of evidence along with the application.

b. Physically Handicapped (*attach proof*)

Three percent of the seats in the undergraduate degree programme are reserved for Physically Handicapped candidates. The applicant should possess minimum qualifying marks and should attach the proof of evidence along with the application. **Maximum age relaxable to 26 Years.**

c. Freedom Fighter (*attach proof*)

One Seat is reserved in B.Sc.(Ag.) for the descendents of Freedom Fighter. For this the certificate should be furnished from Tahsildar of the respective Taluk and enclosed along with the application.

d. Eminent Sports Person (*attach proof*)

Four Seats in B.Sc.(Ag.), and **one seat** in B.Sc.(Hort.), is reserved under sports quota for eminent sports persons. The applicant should possess the minimum qualifying marks and attach the proof of evidence along with the application along with copies of the certificate issued by the Sport Development Authority of Tamil Nadu. Certificates obtained at National/ State/ District / Division level will be considered on the order of merit and hence copies of all relevant certificates should be attached.

iv. MODE OF SELECTION

Candidates will be selected on the basis of the marks in their qualifying examination and ranked as per the procedure given in section(i). **Single window counseling system** is being followed for degrees and campus allotment. **Degree and Campus once allotted can not be changed.**

v. SYSTEM OF EDUCATION

The pattern of instruction and evaluation in the University is the “**Semester Course Credit System**” in the medium of English. An enrolled student in order to earn a Bachelor’s Degree should complete the course credits prescribed from time to time and shall have earned a minimum Overall Grade Point Average (OGPA) of 6.50 out of 10.00.

vi. NOTE BOOK COMPUTERS (LAPTOP)

Laptop is mandatory for the undergraduate students of TNAU. The e-teaching/e-learning practiced in TNAU necessitated the students to have note books for learning as well as writing e-examination. Therefore the admitted candidates should bring the laptop with the recommended specification at the time of commencement of class.

vii. RAGGING

Ragging in any form, place or time is a cognizable offense that will attract severe punishment including summary expulsion from the institution. (Tamil Nadu Government Gazette extraordinary dt 29.01.97, Bill No.8 of 1997 Tamil Nadu Publication of ragging Act.)

viii. FEES AND DEPOSITS

As per the University norms, the fee structure will be increased by 10% every year compared to the previous batch of students. Each selected candidate is required to pay fees as follows according to the institute to which they are allotted.

At the time of counseling, all provisionally selected candidates have to pay a non refundable counseling fee of Rs.2000/- (Rs. 1000/- for SC/ ST)

E1. Vanavarayar Institute of Agriculture, Pollachi. Self-Financing - Fees are as fixed by Government of Tamil Nadu

A Non refundable Counseling fee of Rs. 2000/- (Rs. 1000/- for SC/ST) should be paid to TNAU at the time of Counseling.

ix. SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships and fee concessions such as Adi Dravida Welfare Scholarships, Central Government Scholarships, State Government Free Education for Student from Non-Graduate Family, Periyar Endowment Scholarships and fellowships and scholarships from the Indian Council of Agricultural Research, New Delhi and other agencies are available for the benefit of deserving enrolled candidates. These may vary according to the degree / college to which they are admitted and respective funding agencies.

x. Industry Sponsorship

Five Seats each in all the 12 undergraduate programmes are allotted to the members of the Agribusiness consortium. The candidate should have minimum educational qualification prescribed for the course. For details regarding membership for Consortium of Agribusiness, kindly contact the Dean (Agriculture) & Chairman Admissions, Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, Coimbatore. A request to this effect should be furnished along with the application. Candidates from all over India are eligible to apply.

xi. Non Resident Indian (NRI) Quota

Five seats each in all the 12 undergraduate programmes are allotted under NRI quota. The minimum qualification for admission under this quota is as follows:

1. Age : 25 years
2. Minimum marks : Pass in Qualifying Examination
3. Fees payable : USD 2100/ Semester
4. The candidates should be a Non Resident Indian.
5. A candidate can be sponsored by Non Resident Indian (NRI), who is a close relative of the candidate.

xii. FACILITIES

- i) Hostels with WiFi facility are available for both men and women in each campus and the messes being run by students on a dividing system basis. All students are expected to reside in the hostel attached to the Colleges. In exceptional cases, the Dean is empowered to permit students to be day scholars.
- ii) A Students' Centre with Canteen is present in each campus to provide stationeries and essential items. Plenty of scope for extra-curricular activities such as sports, literary and social service activities.
- iii) Sports facilities and modern fitness centre is available in all campuses.

With regard to the interpretation of the provisions of any matter not covered in this information brochure, the decision of the university shall be final and binding on all the parties concerned.

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INSTRUCTIONS TO CANDIDATES

Completed application form should reach the Dean (Agriculture), Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, Coimbatore - 641 003, on or before 5.00 PM on the date prescribed in the published notification and application form.

- All columns should be correctly and completely filled-in. Enclosures should be completed in all respects.
- Application form with incomplete particulars will be **SUMMARILY REJECTED**.
- Application forms received after the prescribed date and time will not be considered on any account. The University authorities will not take any responsibility for postal delays. The candidates are advised to post their applications well in advance without waiting till the last date for sending the application.
- Candidates should read the Information Brochure carefully and completely before filling in the application form.
- The candidates should ensure that correct marks and community category are furnished in the application. The candidates are informed that after scrutiny, if any information is found to be incorrect, then
 - i) They will forfeit the admission no matter at what stage of the course the student will be at that time;
 - ii) They will be debarred from pursuing any course of study for a period of three years, and
 - iii) Legal proceedings will be initiated against him/her for furnishing false information.
 - iv) Candidates should write their mailing address in the acknowledgment card and affix postage stamp of sufficient value.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS FOR ADMISSIONS

- The candidates shall be required to produce the following certificates in **ORIGINAL at the time of admission**;
 - i) Certificate showing the marks obtained in the HSC/Equivalent qualifying examination in each subject.
 - ii) The Original Community-cum-Nativity Card issued by the revenue authorities as per G.O.Ms.No.781, Revenue Department dated 2.5.1988 and **G.O.Ms.No.36 dated 30-1-96 of Personnel and Administrative Reforms(S) Department read along with G.O.Ms.No.1773, Social Welfare Department, dated 23-6-84 and G.O.Ms.15 dated 22-2-96 of Backward Classes and Most Backward Classes Welfare Department** of the Government of Tamil Nadu. **An attested copy/Xerox copy of the same should be enclosed along with application for record.**
 - iii) Conduct certificate from the Head of the Educational Institution in which the candidate last studied for more than one year.
 - iv) Transfer certificate from the Head of the Educational Institution in which the candidate last studied.
 - v) The candidates who have not studied X, XI and XII standards in Tamil Nadu **should produce the certificate of permanent residence in Tamil Nadu in the prescribed proforma (Certificate - TNAU/2010 -1 appended) from competent authorities.**
 - vi) Medical/Health Certificate in the prescribed form from the Medical Officer, TNAU.
 - vii) To claim the reservation categories mentioned, relevant certificates should be attached with application.
